Science Program Reaching Out (*SPROUT*) brings local schools, after-school programs, summer camps, and other youth organizations to the Washington Youth Garden at the U.S. National Arboretum. We are available Mondays through Fridays, spring through fall, to conduct a free 90-minute garden-based educational experience for all ages. On a limited basis, the program can be facilitated off-site for groups who are unable to make field trips.

Lesson description: Students will explore our one acre child friendly organic garden while learning about plant parts and plant functions, pollination and pollinators, soil and compost, and growing fruits and vegetables. Following this interactive experience, students will participate in an engaging and informative nutrition activity that includes a healthy snack.
